He started working for the City of Box Elder in April of 2021 as the Fleet Manager and has a team of two Technicians to provide maintenance and repair of ALL vehicles in the city's fleet. Kenny has been managing the fleet operations for the City of Box Elder for the past four years.

To earn the CPFP designation, candidates must prove their competency in public fleet operations including the maintenance of vehicles, equipment, facilities and fixed equipment; policies and strategies for fuel, lubricants and repairs; general management and business practices such as strategic and business planning, marketing, and customer service; asset management policies for the determination, utilization, replacement and disposal of vehicles and fixed equipment; financial, risk, technology and human resource management including budgeting, cost recovery, employee training, shop best practices, safety, regulatory and environmental management.
